

School-Age Child Care





of children experienced one or more trauma in their life

48% had a family member who was depressed or mentally ill for a long time.

44% had a family member or someone very close to them who died unexpectedly.

43% were completely separated from their parent(s) for a long time; in foster care, living far apart, or never seeing the parent again.

42% had a family member who was put in jail, or prison, or taken away by the police.

44% were threatened or harassed by a bully (someone outside of his/her family).
